<u>Current Update – October 6, 2023</u>

Public Health Ontario's Weekly COVID-19 Summary

The number of reported COVID-19 cases on September 30th, 2023 was 3,215.

The total deaths caused by covid reported in the week was 21. The total number of covid-19 outbreaks in Ontario during this period was 153.

Health Canada has given its stamp of approval to Pfizer's new COVID-19 vaccine that targets the Omicron XBB.1.5 subvariant. It is said that the vaccine is authorized as a one-dose vaccine for individuals five years of age and older, regardless of their COVID-19 vaccination history. Infants and children between six months and less than five years of age, who have not previously received a complete COVID-19 primary series, should receive three doses. If they have completed a primary series, officials say they should receive one dose.

The National Advisory Committee on Immunization (NACI) is anticipated to provide guidance on the rollout of the newly approved COVID-19 vaccines in the coming months.

Additionally, the latest vaccines are not referred to as "boosters" anymore, instead referring to them as updated vaccines designed to better match the latest circulating strains of the virus. Health Canada stated that they emphasize this is an updated COVID-19 vaccine, just like the flu shots that are available every year. Their idea is that we'll get to a place where it may be much like the flu vaccines, where people may be on a regular schedule getting an updated vaccine.
