<u>Current Update – October 20, 2023</u>

Public Health Ontario's Weekly COVID-19 Summary

The number of reported COVID-19 cases on October 14th, 2023 was 2,519.

The total deaths caused by covid reported in the week was 27. The total number of covid-19 outbreaks in Ontario during this period was 115.

Toronto Public Health is seeking millions more in funding to bolster infection prevention and control in the city's long-term care homes and shelters ahead of what's expected to be a difficult flu and respiratory virus season.

COVID-19 hospitalizations are on the rise across Canada as a wave of autumn infections sweeps the population. The latest numbers are nothing to panic over, infectious diseases experts say, but they can't be ignored either, especially with so many hospitals in the country already operating at or near capacity.

Knowing hospitals across the country struggle to meet demand every time COVID-19 cases rise and that — however small the number — people are still dying due to the coronavirus, Experts said individuals should continue to do anything they can to help limit the spread of COVID-19 and other respiratory viruses.

That includes keeping up to date with COVID-19 and flu vaccines, staying home when sick, wearing a mask in crowded settings and maintaining proper hand hygiene.
