

Coronavirus: COVID-19
Current Update – January 20, 2021

As of January 20th, 2021, Canada has a total of 722, 406 confirmed cases of COVID-19. Ontario itself has 244, 932 cases with Toronto having 77, 872 cases.

Ontario reports more than 2, 600 new cases of COVID-19, 89 additional deaths

Ontario health officials logged 2, 655 new cases of COVID-19 today, as well as 89 more virus-related deaths. The number of cases reported today is a notable jump from the 1, 913 cases reported yesterday, but it is still fewer than the daily case count reported one week ago. There has been a jump in testing over the last 24 hours, with 54, 307 tests processed. According to data released by the Ministry of Health, the test positivity rate across the province now stands at 4.9 percent, down from six percent this time last week.

The rolling seven-day average of new infections now stands at 2, 849, down from nearly 3, 500 one week ago. Today, there were 925 new cases reported in Toronto, 473 in Peel Region, 226 in York Region, 179 in Windsor-Essex County and 129 in Niagara.

On Tuesday, the Ford government confirmed that no shipments of the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine are expected to be delivered next week due to production issues. As a result of this, the province will have to prioritize vaccine distribution even further in the next few weeks, with its primary focus on Long-Term Care.

Ontario's first major COVID-19 vaccine site will stop administering shots immediately

The first COVID-19 immunization site in Toronto and the province that was meant to be a “playbook for mass vaccination clinics” will stop administering shots after just two days in operation. This is due to a shortage of vaccine supply in the province, as Canada will not be receiving any shipments of the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine doses next week as the company deals with a production issue in Belgium.

In a news release, officials in charge of the vaccine site at Metro Convention Centre are saying that North Yorkers for Disabled Persons, Inc. Updated January 20, 2021

they have been directed to stop vaccinations as of Tuesday end of day. Therefore, anyone who booked an appointment to get a shot on Wednesday will no longer be able to get one. According to the province, Ontario's weekly deliveries of this COVID-19 vaccine will be cut by as much as 80 percent over the next month as a result. Premier Ford spoke about this, and expressed his frustration over the circumstances.
